### Affirmation of faith (from the Belhar Confession)

We believe in the triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, who gathers, protects and cares for the church through Word and Spirit. This, God has done since the beginning of the world and will do to the end.

**We believe that Christ's work of reconciliation is made manifest in the Church, as the community of believers who have been reconciled with God and with one another; that unity is, therefore, both a gift and an obligation for the Church of Jesus Christ.**

Turn our hearts, Holy One, to respect and honor those we think are different from us; let us see in peoples of every nation the beauty of the diversity you have created. Hear us, God, and help us see as you see.

We pray for bodies and spirits healed, for those who are in pain, for those awaiting surgery, for those undergoing physical therapy or seeking counseling, for those awaiting death and those awaiting new life. Hear us, God, and help us be compassionate.

For the prayers on the hearts of this congregation, those we name now and those that remain unspoken: [intercessory prayers may be lifted]

Into your hands we place our prayers and all whose welfare we trust you to watch over. Bless them and all who have needs only you know.

Grateful for all your gifts, we pray in the name of the one God, creator of us all, and through Jesus Christ, who taught us to pray, saying, **“Our Father ...”**.
